December 2022 – There were 21 defendants convicted of felony crimes in December 2022. Among the felony convictions were: 2 Violations of Probation, 1 Retail Theft, 1 Domestic Battery, 1 Damage to Property, 4 Aggravated Battery, 1 Aggravated Sexual Abuse, 1 Unlawful Failure to Register Sex Offender, 1 Burglary, 1 Obstruct Justice, 1 Possession of Cannabis, 2 Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine, 1 Unlawful Possession of Controlled Substance, 1 Aggravated DUI and 4 DWLR.

January 2023 – There were 23 defendants convicted of felony crimes in January 2023. Among the felony convictions were: 10 Violations of Probation, 1 Fraudulent ID, 2 Domestic Battery, 2 Aggravated Battery,

1 Unlawful Failure to Register Sex Offender, 1 Unlawful Use of Weapon, 2 Violate Order Protection, 2 Harassment, 2 Possession of Child Pornography, 1 Possession of Cannabis, 5 Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine, 2 Unlawful Possession of Controlled Substance, 1 Aggravated DUI and 1 DWLR.

This report does NOT include statistics for bond reduction hearings, Sexual Dangerous Persons petitions, post-trial petitions, post-conviction petitions, mental health petitions, Statutory Summary Suspension hearings, Petitions to Revoke Probation hearings, suppression hearings, and other motion and pretrial hearings.
